Dear Patients and Parents!

I recall carrying a beeper and stopping at the nearest pay phone with four kids in the car. I also remember the days when I would write a pediatric newsletter every single month! It has been a pleasure to share the office with Dr. Shelley Loui, and now with Dr. Jenny Welham who will take over my practice. I am confident I am leaving all of you in good hands. Jenny is passionate about child health and prevention and she is dedicated, available and accessible. She has 18 years of experience in Virginia and Hawaii and is always positive. Her family lives in Palolo. Her husband is a pilot and her two children attend Kaimuki Christian School. I told Jenny that I would probably be around to cover for her if she needs me. And I may work here one or two mornings a week for a few months.
